Tone 7 Troparion (Resurrection)

By Your Cross, You destroyed Death. To the Thief, You opened Paradise. For the Myrrh-bearing women, You changed weeping into joy. Christ God, You commanded Your disciples to proclaim that You are risen, granting the world great mercy.

Tone 3 Troparion (For the Temple)

O Mother of God, sheltered by thy coming / we faithful people today keep feast in joy, / and looking at thy most pure image, / moved to the depths of our hearts, we say:/ "Protect us with thy precious veil /and deliver us from every ill, // by entreating Christ, thy Son and our God, to save our souls."
